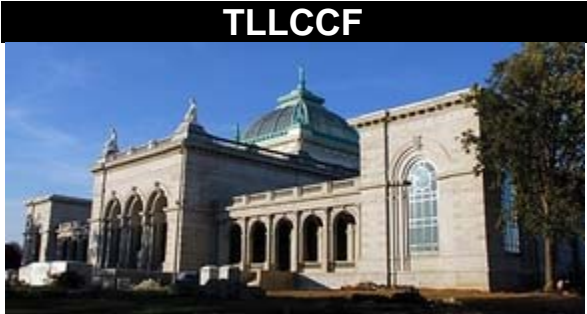


Really, It's On A Thursday!

2009 Child Care Center Enhancement Grants and Annual Meeting

The 2009 TLLCCF Annual Meeting was held on Tuesday, May 19 at the PNC Bank Center in Philadelphia. PNC donated use of the facility to the Foundation to hold its annual meeting. The space proved ideal for mingling during cocktail hour with invited guests, conducting Foundation business and presenting the evening's awards and installation of Foundation officers.

This year the Foundation presented 21 Child Care Center Enhancement Grants. Grants are given to nonprofit, nonsectarian child care centers in the five counties in southeastern Pennsylvania to implement specific changes and to improve the quality of child care provided. The grants totaled \$39,103 and will provide long-term benefits for the centers and the children they serve.

United Way of Southeastern PA is Aiming High

What is the right way to read a story to a child? Are there things that children can learn about reading before actually reading? How can children encourage their own parents to read to them every night?

The answers to these questions are found in United Way of Southeastern Pennsylvania's new book on early literacy development, **Aiming HIGH**. **Aiming HIGH** is a collection of short stories, written by teachers and parents from United Way's Early To Read project. In addition to publishing examples of emergent literacy best practices, the stories reveal the qualities and skills of exceptional early childhood teachers. When young children form attachments with nurturing adults who understand developmentally appropriate practice and honor a child's right to play they can begin to develop the skills they need to succeed in school and life.

Launched in 2003 with the help of a generous grant from the John S. and James L. Knight Foundation, United Way's five-year Early To Read project was developed in an effort to improve the emergent literacy skills of pre-kindergarten children in 16 child care programs located in North and West Philadelphia neighborhoods. United Way works throughout the region to advance the common good by focusing on education for children, income for families and health for seniors – the building blocks of a good life.
